 Entries are limited to 2 works per artist.

 Maximum size of each entry (including frame) 130cm x 100cm, this is the complete work no matter how many pieces.
 All entries must be the original, new unaided work of the artist.
 Entries must not be produced in a structured workshop.
 Artwork must be clearly and securely labelled and tagged showing artist's name, title of the work, medium and price.
 Works must be delivered ready to hang fitted with D rings, wire or cord.
 The Raglan Board reserves the right to refuse to hang work deemed not suitable for display.
 Judging will be held on Friday 2nd October 2020.
 The judge's decision will be final and no discussion will be entered into.
 All entries must be available for sale. Please write the sale price on your entry form and on painting labels/tags. The Raglan will deduct commission of 25% for members or 30% for non-members from the sale price.
 Insurance of the entries is the responsibility of the exhibitor. All care will be taken but no responsibility assumed for damage, loss or theft. It is the responsibility of the artist to collect their painting after the event (if not sold) or pay for postage.

The Art in Miniature Canberra friendship group would like to invite you to a delight of miniature art works, an art form that has existed since the 8th Century. It was then that the Islamic influence flowed through to Indian, Chinese and Nth African art. In the Western world the earliest examples can be found in the illuminated capital letters of church manuscripts. The letters were often decorated in pure gold leaf and around them were pictures of everyday life, or scenes from the Bible.

The group has been exhibiting since its inception in 2001. This year is the group's 20th exhibition.

FIONA SMITH & CHARLOTTE WHITBY



"We are drawn back to the plains and the mountains in all the seasons of the year, our hearts fluttering like Bogong moths as we catch sight of the granite boulders of Berridale. They are scattered among paddocks as if tossed aside by a petulant marble-playing giant."

Artists Charlotte Whitby and Fiona Smith both have deep connections to the Snowy-Monaro Region. They have teamed up to stage an exhibition of their paintings at Cooma's Raglan Gallery, from August 15 to September 26.

Charlotte married into a six-generation Toowoomba
Valley farming family, moving from Canada as a new
bride to live in Cooma and work as a graphic designer in Jindabyne. Fiona's
family have been involved in operating ski lodges since the 1940s through the
Southern Alps club and then the Australian Alpine Club.

The artists both now live in Sydney and are drawn up the Monaro Highway multiple times a year.
